A **process** of planning, programming and implementation of sustainable forestry

- at national
- at sub-national levels
- common set of guiding principles
- broad inter-sectoral approach in courses of action and evaluation .

The **purpose** of a NFP is to establish a social and political framework for sustainable development of forests, - which will increase public and private involvement and funding.
